- Describe how to synthesize information to inform safety decisions.
- Identify common errors in conducting assessment.

- Explain the scope and purpose of assessing family strengths and needs and risk of future harm.
- Describe how to gather and analyze relevant information and assess family strengths and needs and risk of future harm.
- Describe how to analyze and synthesize information to inform case decisions.
