

ONLINE TEACHING CERTIFICATION



LSC-Online provides an **Online Teaching Certification** course as a resource to provide faculty with a basic knowledge of D2L components in order to effectively create, manage, and facilitate an online course. Instructors teaching an online or hybrid course are required to complete this training in order to teach online courses. The topics covered in the course include student engagement, student interaction, student contact, faculty contact, community building, common social media tools, learning management system (LMS) tools, online tutoring, online proctoring, design for accessibility, copyright, online resources, SoftChalk, Cisco WebEx, and open educational resources.

The full Online Teaching Certification course contains two parts: 1) Quick Onboarding, which provides introductory information on the LMS, support options, and best practices, and 2) Full Certification, where upon successful completion of the remaining modules, you will receive the online teaching certification. This certification allows you to teach online and hybrid courses at Lone Star College and is valid until there is a major LMS change.

This certification course is built using a competency-based education (CBE) model and is designed to be completed at your own pace. There are also accompanying activities so you can begin building an online course while taking the certification course.

- ☐ Complete any necessary Online Teaching Certification (OTC)
 - See Faculty Instructions for Viewing Certification Status (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/otc) to determine what certification you may need.
 - In D2L, go to VTAC Support > Learning > Enroll Me: OTC to sign up for the OTC.

Course Shell Verification

- ☐ Verify your course shell is present in your D2L course list. (https://vimeo.com/218210599)
 - If it is not, check in iStar. Contact your Chair or Division Operations Manager (DOM) if the course is missing in iStar. Contact the IT Service Desk if it is only missing in D2L.
- ☐ Activate your D2L section early (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/a005)
 - Activation allows your students to:
 - Access your course once the start date arrives.
 - See the course link in their My Courses list if they are enrolled in the course.
 - Verify that their course registration is accurate prior to the first day of class.

Confirm Roster


- □ Verify your D2L roster (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/reconcile-roster)
 - In D2L, go to VTAC Support > Self-Service > User Access > Reconcile Your Rosters



- Click the [Enroll into D2L] or [Un-enroll from D2L] button to correct the roster. Repeat for each student until the roster is fully reconciled.
- NOTE: Without this tool, it can take up to 24 hours for iStar updates to be reflected in D2L.
- ☐ Merge course rosters. (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/merge-course-rosters)
 - To merge multiple course rosters, go to VTAC Support > Self-Service
 Course Design > Merge Course Rosters



- ☐ Add other instructors, TAs, etc. (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/add-user)
 - In D2L, go to VTAC Support > Self-Service > User Access > Add a User to Your Section



- Submit the request form with the Employee Email Address,
 Username, or ID for all the other instructors, TAs, etc. you want to have access to your course.
- NOTE: You must have the Employee Email, Username, or ID of the user; you cannot search with the user's name.

Build Course Content

- ☐ Build, import, or update course content.
 - Build, copy, import, or update course components from a Community Group, Sandbox, or previous course as needed. (https://vtac.lonestar.edu/help/copy-course-components-simple)
 - NOTE: We recommended building your course content in a Community Group or Sandbox first and copying into your course(s) each semester, rather than building the course content directly in a course shell. Many departments have shared Community Groups for certain courses, check with yours to see if there is shared Content you can use.
- ☐ Update all course dates (due dates, date restrictions, etc.).
 - Add any other desired restrictions, conditional releases, or calendar dates. The Manage Dates tool is available from the Course Management > Course Admin link on the navbar.
- ☐ Update the Lockdown Browser Dashboard after you copy a course.
 - o If you use LockDown Browser and have copied quizzes from another course or previous semester, the Dashboard must be visited before the first quiz to avoid student errors. Click on Course Activities > Quizzes and click the LockDown Browser tab to accomplish this task.

The technologies below are supported by the LSC-Online team through VTAC Chat or your campus Instructional Technologist/Designer.

D₂L

The D2L Learning Environment provides a platform for online course content in face-to-face, hybrid and online courses. Supporting documentation is found in VTAC by browsing the menu to the left or using the search box in the upper right corner of the screen.

Respondus

- **Respondus 4.0** is an exam authoring software that can be used to create exams and publish to D2L.
- **StudyMate** provides learning activities including flashcards, crosswords, and self-assessment guizzes to help students master content.
- Respondus LockDown Browser helps increase exam security by preventing students from printing, using other applications, or visiting other websites while an exam is open. Computers in assessment centers all have Respondus LockDown Browser installed.
- **Respondus Monitor** adds automated proctoring to Respondus Lockdown Browser, recording the student's screen while taking the exam and their testing environment using a webcam. Proctoring results are available to the instructor after the exam is complete.

SoftChalk

SoftChalk is content authoring software that can be used to create engaging, media-rich lessons for your online courses. SoftChalk allows instructors to incorporate images, audio, video and even quizzes into content modules. Lessons can be stored in SoftChalk Cloud for ease of access and can be shared with the global Softchalk Community or just to specified individuals or groups.

Turnitin

Turnitin.com is an online database that checks for plagiarism in papers and detects if students wrote a paper using the AI tools ChatGPT and GPT3. Faculty can use Turnitin.com by simply clicking a checkbox within any Assignment in D2L. Students can also use Turnitin.com to check their work before submitting. For account access information for students, contact your campus Professional Development centers.

WebEx - Supported by the IT Service Desk

WebEx is video conferencing software that allows instructors to set up synchronous meeting times with students via the web. WebEx combines desktop sharing, video, and phone conferencing. All employees have a general WebEx account. You can find more information about Webex here.

YuJa, the video platform supported by LSC-Online, offers many exciting features, including machine captioning, video quizzing, and a video editor

Zoom - Supported by the IT Service Desk

Zoom is video conferencing software that allows instructors to set up synchronous meeting times with students via the web. Zoom is an alternative to Webex, both applications are supported by Lone Star College. You can find more information about Zoom here.

D2L Virtual Assistant

The D2L Virtual Assistant is available at any time by clicking "Get Help" in the bottom right corner of D2L. The Virtual Assistant is an Al-based help tool that provides easy access to D2L Help documentation, VTAC help documentation, VTAC Support, IT Service Desk chat, and D2L Help Desk chat. If you have simple questions or need direction on a specific issue, you can turn to the virtual assistant for help.

D2L Help Desk

The <u>D2L Help Desk</u> offers 24/7 support for all LSC Faculty, Staff and Students. They are available via Chat, Phone, or Support Ticket. The D2L Helpdesk offers assistance with topics such as commonly used D2L tools (e.g., adding content, assignment folders, quizzes, gradebook) and other D2L questions (e.g., intelligent agents, awards, groups, rubrics, statistics).

LSC-Online

<u>LSC-Online</u> provides instructional support and course design assistance through the Virtual Teaching Assistance Center (VTAC) site. VTAC Support is also available for phone or WebEx appointments.

IT Service Desk

The <u>IT Service Desk</u> provides technical support for basic D2L questions and issues, campus computers, myLoneStar/iStar, email accounts, and licensed software, such as Office 365 and Adobe Creative Cloud. The IT Service Desk offers a team of support personnel to assist faculty with technical issues - 6 a.m. – midnight, 7 days a week.
