Acute & Ambulatory

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Acute (EH) Objective 5: Patient Electronic Access to Health Information

Measure 1 (Patient Access) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients discharged from an eligible hospital's inpatient or emergency department during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 1 (Patient Access) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient or patient authorized representative must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must be provided access to their health information to view online, download, transmit and access through a third party
- 3) The health information needs to be made available to the patient within 24 hours of the information being available to the provider.
- 4) This is accomplished by providing the patient or patient authorized representative a PIN.

Measure 2 (Patient Specific Education) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients discharged from an eligible hospital's inpatient or emergency department during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 2 (Patient Specific Education) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient must be provided electronic access to patient-specific educational resources based on a Patient's Problems or Medications identified from the CEHRT during the EHR reporting period.

Acute (EH) Objective 6: Coordination of Care

Measure 1 (V-D-T) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients discharged from an eligible hospital's inpatient or emergency department during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 1 (V-D-T) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must have viewed online, downloaded or transmitted to a third party the patient's health information during the EHR reporting period.
OR
The patient or patient authorized representative must have accessed their health information through the use of an API during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 2 (Secure Messaging) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients discharged from an eligible hospital's inpatient or emergency department during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 2 (Secure Messaging) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must have received a secure electronic message, either a new message or in reply to a message a patient or patient authorized representative sent, during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 3 (Patient generated health data) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients discharged from an eligible hospital's inpatient or emergency department during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 3 (Patient generated health data) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) Patient generated health data or patient updates would need to be accepted to satisfy this measure, during the EHR reporting period.

Ambulatory (EP) Objective 5: Patient Electronic Access to Health Information

Measure 1 (Patient Access) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 1 (Patient Access) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient or patient authorized representative must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must be provided access to their health information to view online, download, transmit and access through a third party
- 3) The health information needs to be made available to the patient within four business days of the information being available to the provider.
- 4) This is accomplished by providing the patient or patient authorized representative a PIN.

Measure 2 (Patient Specific Education) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 2 (Patient Specific Education) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient must be provided electronic access to patient-specific educational resources based on a Patient's Problems or Medications identified from the CEHRT during the EHR reporting period.

Ambulatory (EP) Objective 6: Coordination of Care

Measure 1 (V-D-T) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 1 (V-D-T) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must have viewed online, downloaded or transmitted to a third party the patient's health information during the EHR reporting period.
OR
The patient or patient authorized representative must have accessed to their health information through the use of an API during the EHR reporting period.
- 3) A patient seen during the reporting period who receives access at the first encounter and does not receive access at the second, or subsequent, encounters will populate and record the numerator at the first encounter and will decrement the numerator for the first subsequent visit, in which the required data is not provided within the required time period.

Measure 2 (Secure Messaging) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 2 (Secure Messaging) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) The patient or patient authorized representative must have received a secure electronic message, either a new message or in reply to a message a patient or patient authorized representative sent, during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 3 (Patient generated health data) Denominator Requirements

We increment the denominator for all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period.

Measure 3 (Patient generated health data) Numerator Requirements

- 1) The patient must exist in the denominator.
- 2) Patient generated health data or patient updates would need to be accepted to satisfy this measure, during the EHR reporting period.

Definitions:

Reporting period:

The date defined when generating the report. Typically, the reporting period is the reporting year. In some cases the reporting period could be less than the calendar year.

Reporting year:

The reporting year is now the calendar year for both EH/CAH and EP's.

Patient Access:

Patient access is defined as the last step the clinic or hospital has to perform in order for the patient to continue the full registration process.

In the case of the IntelliChart® portal that would be either issuing a PIN to the patient or authenticating the self-registered patient. At that point the patient has the ability to complete the full registration process without any further intervention from the clinic or hospital.
