




## Readiness Centers Equal Readiness

• ARNG Readiness Centers (RCs)—previously called armories—are foundational facilities for ARNG readiness (43% Combat; 27% Combat Spt; 38% Combat Svc Spt).



The Readiness Center Transformation Master Plan (RCTMP):

Reduces RCs from >2300 to <1700 over a 15-year period.



#### **ARIMD P4 PILOT Program Status**

- ✓ ARIMD P4 Pilot contract awarded thru Baltimore District COE to provide training & facilitation support to Readiness Divisions to identify potential partnership opportunities to maximize cost savings/cost avoidance.
- ✓ ARIMD P4 Team visited all 4 Readiness Divisions, collected, identified and ranked 61 potential P4 projects utilizing 5 criteria across 6 general categories.
- ✓ One IGSA was finalized under Pilot Program between the 88th Readiness Division and Oakland County Michigan for Grounds Maintenance at Waterford, MI ARC. CAR gave verbal authorization for MG Reinhart to approve that IGSA.
