









- In Oct 2019 the Secretary and CSA directed a Quality of Life Task Force
- Review the full range of Army care, support, and enrichment programs
- Emphasis housing, health care, childcare, spouse employment, PCS moves, and support and resilience (Alaska, Ft. Irwin, Ft. Polk, Ft. Hood)
- 18 Mar 2020, QOL charter signed by SECARMY
- Dec 2020, the QOL Campaign integrated into the Army Campaign Plan,
 Objective 11 (11.2: Improve QOL programs)

(ARMY) CHARTER QUALITY OF LIFE TASK FORCE

- 1. Name of Committee: Army Quality of Life Task Force (QOL TF)
- Category and Type of Committee: Intra-Army
- 3. Date Established: New committee
- Authority: Director of Army Staff Memo: HQDA-191107-336Q, 6 November 19

- <u>Date To Be Terminated</u>: This advisory function is needed on a continuing basis.
 However, this task force will terminate on completion of its mission or three years from the date this charter is approved, whichever is earlier, unless extended by the Secretary of the Army or designee.
- 7. <u>Purpose</u>: At the direction of the Secretary of the Army and the Chief of Staff of the Army, the Deputy Chief of Staff (DCS), G-9 is the lead agency for synchronizing and providing principal oversight for the Quality of Life (QCL) portfolio in accordance with authorities outlined in General Orders 2020-01. The DCS, G-9 will act with broad authority to strengthen QOL programs Armywide, benefiting Soldiers, Families, Civilians, and Soldiers for Life. The Army QOL TF will take the following action:
- a. Evaluate and identify gaps and overlaps across a full range of Army care, support, and enrichment programs, with initial emphasis on housing, healthcare, childcare, spouse employment, and permanent change of station moves to provide effective, efficient, and well-executed QQL programs to the Army's number one asset, its People. The effort will expand to include other QQL-related programs, policies, and requirements outside the initial six lines of effort (LQEs).


The QOL TF Charter

- Designates DCS, G-9 lead for QOL TF, with stakeholder collaboration
- Requires:
 - Weekly Working Group Meetings
 - Monthly USA and VCSA update
 - Quarterly report to SA and CSA
- Ensures oversight by ASA (M&RA) and ASA (IE&E) IAW GO-1

Outcome

 Ensure HQDA-level requirements to provide predictable, flexible, adaptable, and tailorable QOL programs with emphasis at installation with critical QOL needs such as Forts Wainwright/Greely, Fort Polk, Fort Irwin, and Fort Hood.







QOL Wins



Housing

- Implemented all Tenant Bill of Rights at 37 of 44 privatized housing
- Implemented 100% "change of occupancy" inspections and checks on life, health, and safety work orders
- Investing in barracks and the total Family housing program
- Hired additional government oversight personnel for privatized and government housing

· Health Care

- Expanded virtual health for primary, specialty, and preventive care in response to COVID-19
- Launched the COVID-19 Information Hotline

Child Care

- Operating child and school age care in the COVID-19 environment
- Increasing capacity (Family Child Care, construction, off-post care, hourly care, streamline hiring/supervision)
- Implemented DoD updated child care placement priorities

Spouse Employment

- Strengthening military spouse preference implementation
- > Implemented spouse licensure reimbursement; working with OSD on reciprocity
- Codified home based business policy and application process
- Promoting OSD initiatives (My Career Advancement Account, Military Spouse Employment Program)

· Permanent Change of Station Moves

- Continuing safety and security guidelines for moving companies; requiring background checks
- Increased reimbursement from 95% to 100% to offset costs for Soldiers who move themselves
- Launched "Army PCS Moves" app info on entitlements, move types, plan/schedule move, and claims, etc.
- Issuing orders ~120 days prior to the report date to improve move planning
- Support and Resilience (Alaska, Polk, Irwin, Hood)
 - ▶ Identified "Big Four" (USARAK, Hood, Irwin, and Polk) as locations requiring critical QOL improvements
 - Launched Digital Garrison and Giving apps
 - > Improving healthcare staffing at Alaska, Polk, Irwin
 - Piloting Army Community Service certifications
