



Land Acknowledgement




























































Native Profiles







Laura Beltz Wright, sister of Senator Beltz. She was a member of the ATG at Haycock. She ran dog team, ran mail, caught her own fish for her dogs. Best shot in the company, shooting 49 bull's-eyes out of 50. She was queen and her daughter was queen of Fairbanks. One of her sons, Hegberg, is vice president of Wien Airlines.



Elizabeth Peratrovich

- Raven family Tlingit
- July 4, 1911 (Petersburg) December 1, 1958 (Seattle)
- Civil Rights Leader for Alaska Natives
- Authored Anti-Discrimination Act of 1945
- February 16th is Elizabeth Peratrovich Day











Benny Benson

- Alutiiq
- October 12, 1913 (Chignik) July 2, 1972 (Kodiak)
- Designed Alaska state flag at age 13
 - The blue field is for the Alaska sky and the forget-me-not, an Alaska flower. The North Star is for the future state of Alaska, the most northerly in the union. The Dipper is for the Great Bear symbolizing strength.
- July 9th is Alaska Flag Day





Laura Beltz Wright

- Iñupiaq
- 1909 (Candle) 1996 (Anchorage)
- Private in the Alaska Territorial Guard, 1942-1947
- Patented the "Wright Alaskan Parky"
- Her life was "more unbelievable than a novel"










Federal History

- Dawes Severalty Act (1887)
 - Federal government redistributed tribal lands to heads of families in 160 acre allotments with the hope to turning them into farmers
 - Unclaimed or surplus land was sold with the proceeds used to fund Indian schools where Native children learned to read and write English and Anglo social systems
- Indian Citizenship Act (1924)
 - Granted citizenship to all Native Americans born in the U.S.
 - Each state control voting rights until 1957
- Indian Reorganization Act (1934)
 - Prohibited allotment of tribal lands, returned some surplus land urged tribes to engage in self-government


