

48%



A Vision and Concept

Military Spouse Coworking Space

Key Attributes

- Adequate demand (assess interest and requirements using local spouse network).
- Located on- or off-installation.
- Available at no or minimal cost.
- ☐ Ideally available 24/7; not an initial requirement.
- Provides easy access to WiFi and printing capability.
- □ Provides adequate seating and work space that may include table space, desk space, seating areas, individual cubicles / offices, and meeting rooms / conference rooms.
- □ A training and networking venue focused on military spouse employment opportunities.

Multi-functional Space

- Entrepreneurial
- □ Remote work
- Training
- Networking
- Career services

Military Spouse Coworking Space



December 2020

Six months of interviews, market research, cost analysis, and hypothesis testing.

There is strong support for military spouse coworking, and any future space should be developed through strong partnerships across DoD, military support organizations, and by continuing to place spouses' needs at the center.

Proof of Concept: Fort Belvoir & Austin

Military Spouse Coworking Space

Fort Belvoir, Virginia

- August 2020: Initial dialog with national partners on the challenges self-employed and remoteworking military spouses face finding professional workspace.
- Metro DC USO repurposed existing space at Fort Belvoir USO for MilSpouse coworking space (\$200,000+ funded solely by Metro DC USO).
- ☐ Integration of installation programs; USO maintains existing relationship across installation, local and state resources.
- □ Conducted "soft opening" on 08 MAR 21; anticipate "grand opening" post-COVID.

Fort Belvoir USO space became 1st in the world for the entire Department of Defense.



Austin ISO Army Futures Command and USAREC

- July 2021: Discussed initiative during SFL engagement with Austin Community College (ACC) Executive Vice Chancellor of Operations and Public Affairs and local partners; ACC agreed to establish a coworking space at their North Austin campus.
- □ ACC will provide a three-phased approach: PH 1: existing facilities; PH 2: expanded space at north campus; PH 3: expansion to additional campuses.
- ☐ September 2021: HQDA G9 Chief of Army Partnerships conducted follow up visit to asses program establishment.





- ☐ Fort Belvoir and Fort Knox serve as a "proof of concept" model for future implementation considerations on-installation.
- ☐ Expanding opportunities off-installation (Austin, Colorado Springs and Boston) to serve as models for future expansion considerations.
- □ HQDA G9-facilitated, RAND-produced "commander's handbook / guide" for establishing and using MilSpouse coworking space (within input from national partners) is in development → due in November '21.
