2.	Which course goals does this assignment fulfill?
3.	Brainstorm every step of the process that a student might go through to complete the assignment (starting with lecture and reading, all the way through submitting it and incorporating feedback.)
4.	Circle the steps above that are most critical for the student to do without any outside aid. Then put a "?" next to steps where outside aid might not interfere with your learning goals, provided students can still do the circled parts by themselves.
5.	How might students use AI on this assignment in ways that undermine their fulfillment of your learning goals? How might their use of AI backfire on them?
6.	How could you modify your assignment or instructions to discourage uses of AI that undermine course goals? How could you verify that the student had mastered the material without relying on AI detection tools? Use the "Tips & Guidelines" handout as a source of ideas, Use the back of this worksheet if needed.)
