

## Alliance for Fort Gordon/Eisenhower - History

The Alliance was created in March 2003 by Congressman Charlie Norwood as a non-profit organization with the primary mission to create awareness in the community of the threat of base closure and the potential economic impact should Ft Gordon be downsized or closed.

In November 2005, the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Commission Report became law and Fort Gordon was officially spared any negative impact from this latest round of base realignment and closure. The primary reason Fort Gordon survived was its military value - the ability to efficiently and effectively perform its assigned missions and its potential to support new missions. Other major contributing factors, however, were the strong community support for our servicemembers and their families and the outstanding quality of life enjoyed by area residents.








Fort Gordon Army Compatible Use Buffer Program

## Advocacy I-20

4 February 2024 engagement

#### Key points:

- The project is currently in the early stages of the scoping phase. Scoping identifies obstacles, improvements, initial environmental requirements.
- Scoping also assesses the operational and safety impacts of traffic.
- The scoping phase transitions into concept design.
- The concept design (30%) provides more fidelity on phasing, costs, and timelines.
- The time from the initial scoping phase to 30% concept design is approximately 2yrs.
- A full environmental assessment if required will exceed 2 years.
- Overall project cost +/- 10 miles of the interchange is approximately \$210M.

#### Due outs:

- The Garrison will provide the latest information on traffic counts at gates 1 and 6.
- GDOT will publish meeting minutes in about a week.


