Forestry staff inspected a public tree in the City-owned right-of-way near this property. The result of the inspection is below:

___ The tree(s) has/have been marked for **removal** due to one or more of the following: advanced decay, disease, excessive die-back, dead or public hazard.

___ The tree(s) has/have been scheduled for **pruning** for one or more of the following: remove deadwood, elevate low limbs, clear vision obstruction.

___ There is no cause for action. No removal or maintenance is necessary at this time based on **current** conditions—or—The tree is on private property, and Forestry has no jurisdiction.

___ A work order already exists for the work requested, and no changes to the tree’s condition have been noted since the last inspection. This request will be closed. The original work order will remain open.

If a work order has been created, the work will occur at a future date. The work order has been given the following priority:

___ Priority 1: Maintenance or removal is necessary, but is not considered an emergency at this time. These work orders will be prioritized and completed based on the order that they were created.

___ Priority 2: Routine maintenance or removal is necessary, but **current** conditions do not indicate an imminent risk of failure. These work orders will be placed on our regular work schedule.
