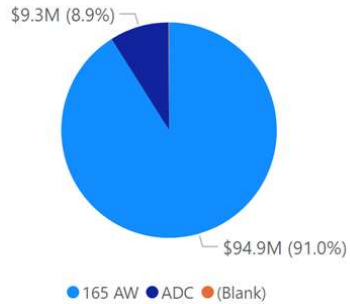

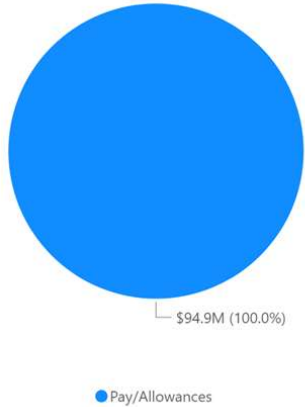

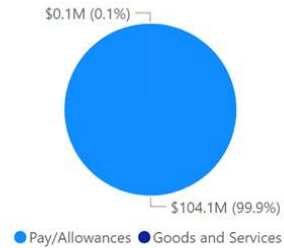
IMPACT BY UNIT

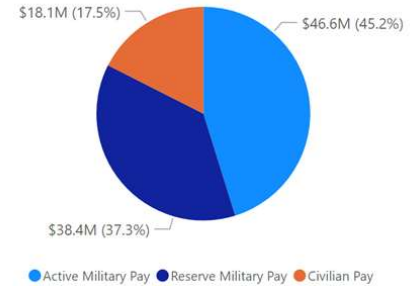

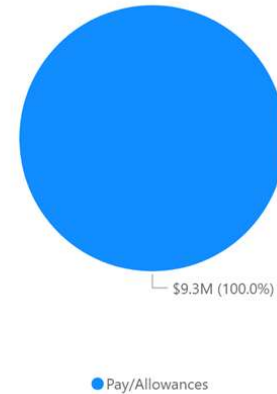

IMPACT FROM PAYROLL



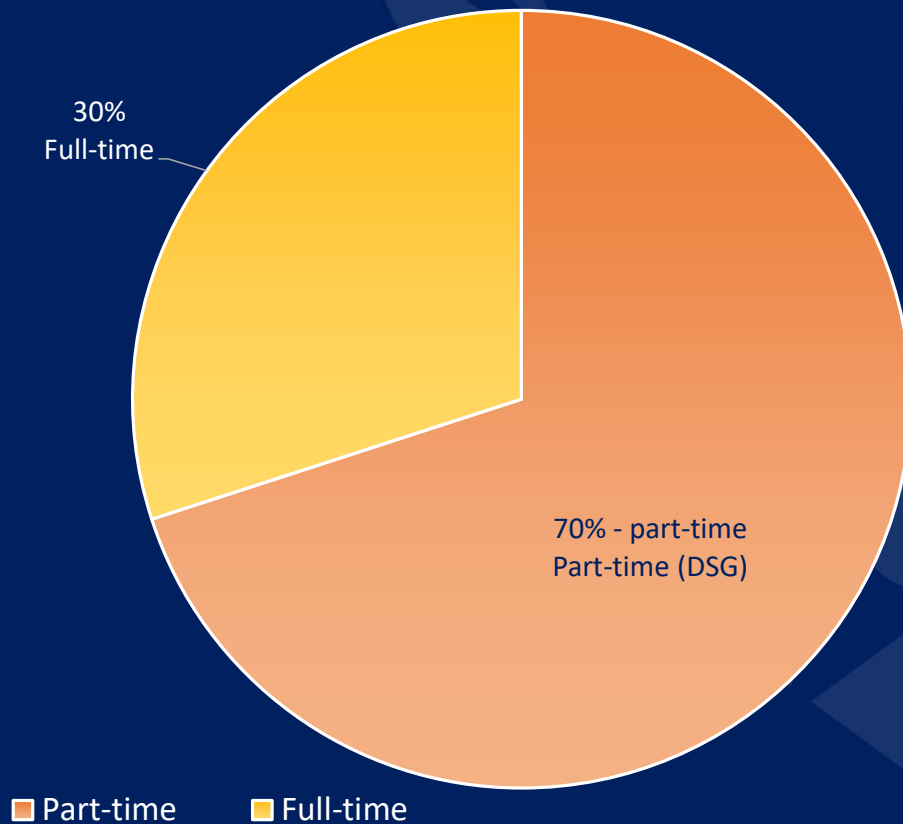
IMPACT FROM ADC BY SUBTYPE

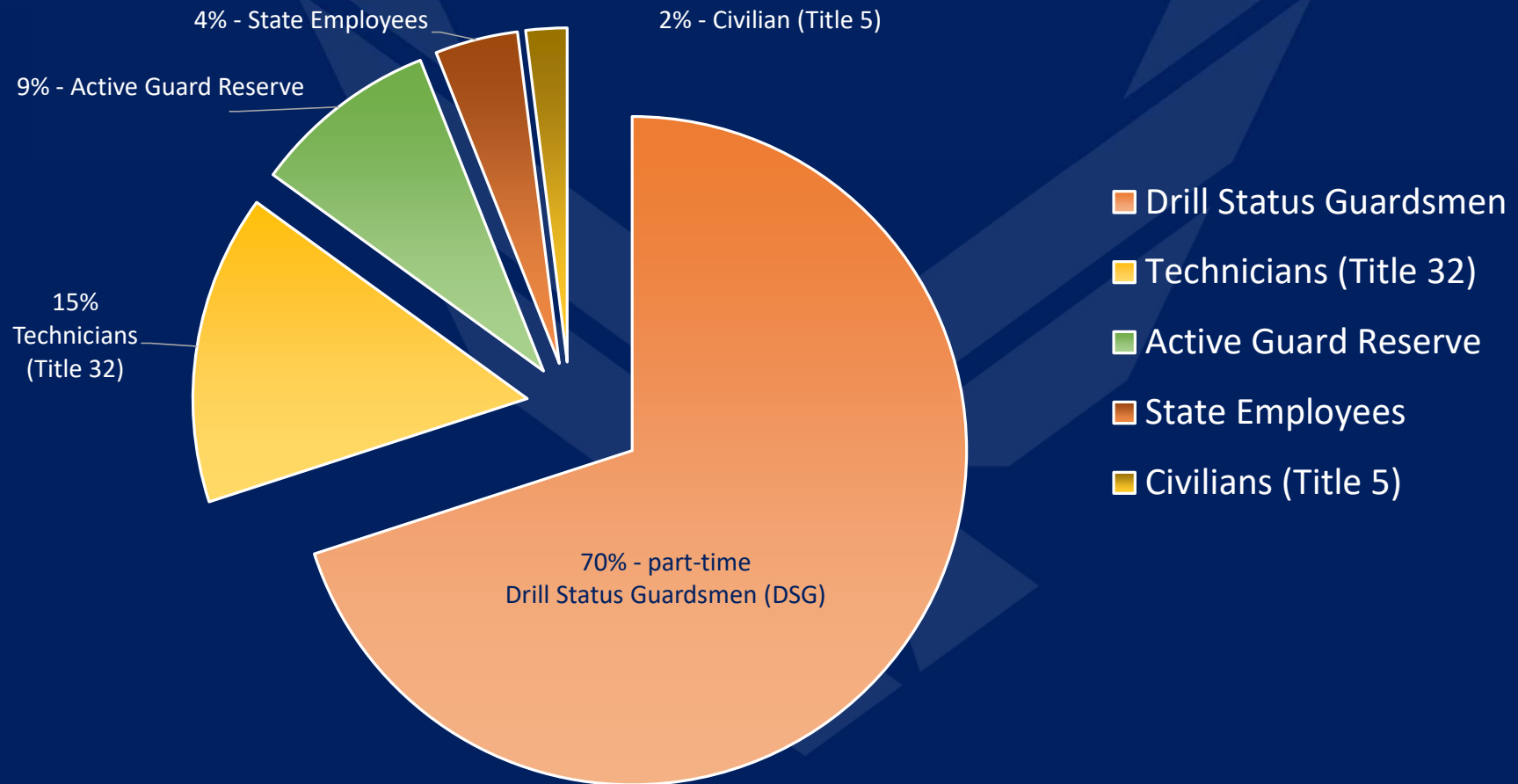

Coastal Georgia Military Affairs Council

- CGMAC Advocates for Coastal Georgia Military Support
- The primary objective is to advocate for the ongoing development and support of military activities, installations, personnel, and families in Coastal Georgia.
- Recent key topics included securing planning and design funding for key projects at Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield, protecting the Coastal Regional Training Center (CRTC), and obtaining the last four C-130Js for the 165th Airlift Wing, that are currently in production.



Installation Support Efforts to Date



Chatham County Animal Services has an Intergovernmental Support Agreement with HAAF to assist with animal-related calls on post.



Chatham County engineering has a long-standing relationship with US Army Corps of Engineers for various drainage projects impacting citizens on and off base, as well as collaborative work on the Hutchinson Island boat ramp and Savannah Harbor Expansion Project.



Chatham County Mosquito Control has various agreements in place to support search and research efforts using FLIR camera with US Coast Guard and Air National Guard.



Chatham County Mosquito Control manages educational awareness and such as requested for mosquito borne disease activity in proximity to HAAF.



Chatham County is currently facilitating conversations with Chatham Area Transit for pilot program to assist soldiers and their families with access to transportation on and off base; during traditional and nontraditional work hours.

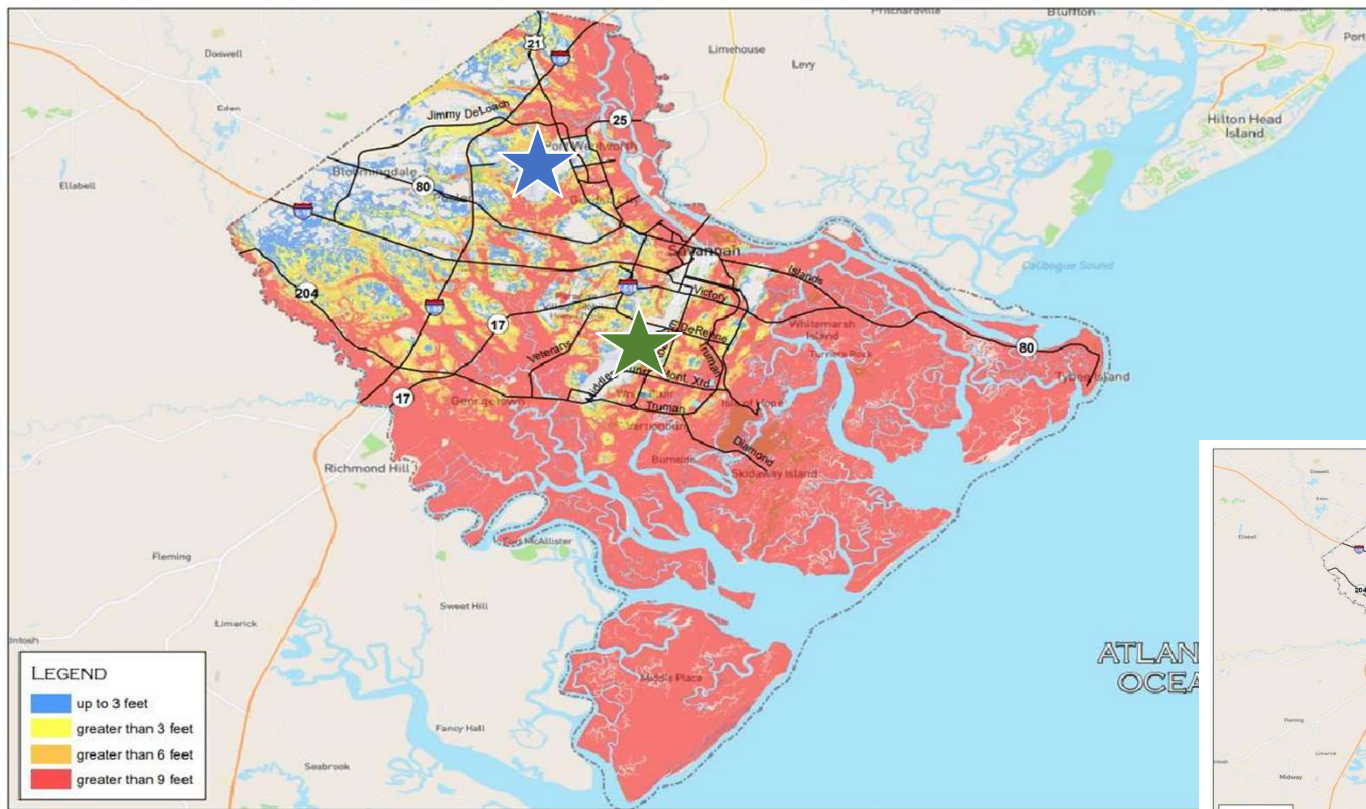

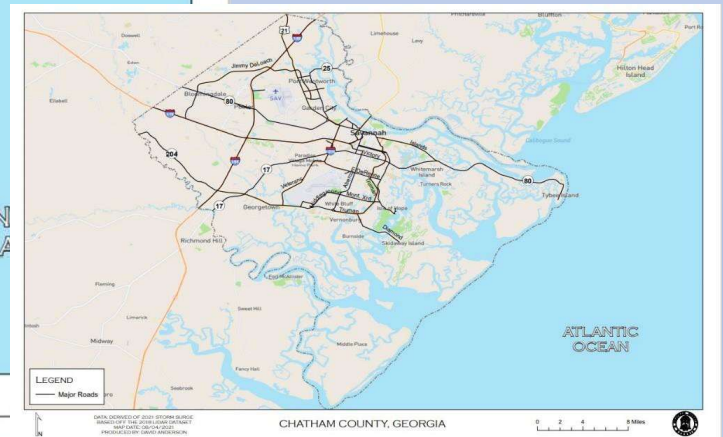
Storm Surge: Category 5 Hurricane

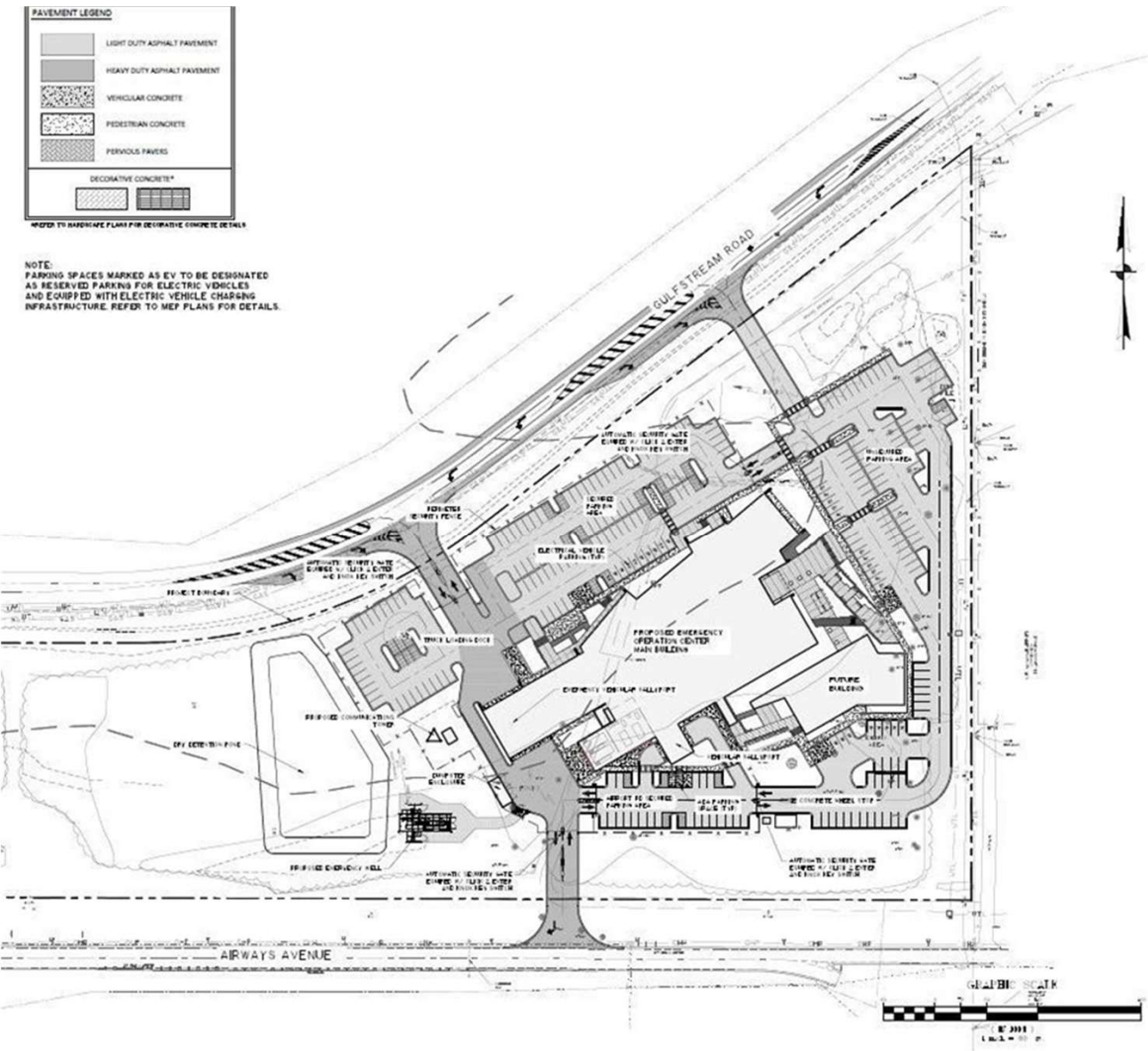
Community Infrastructure

 - Transportation



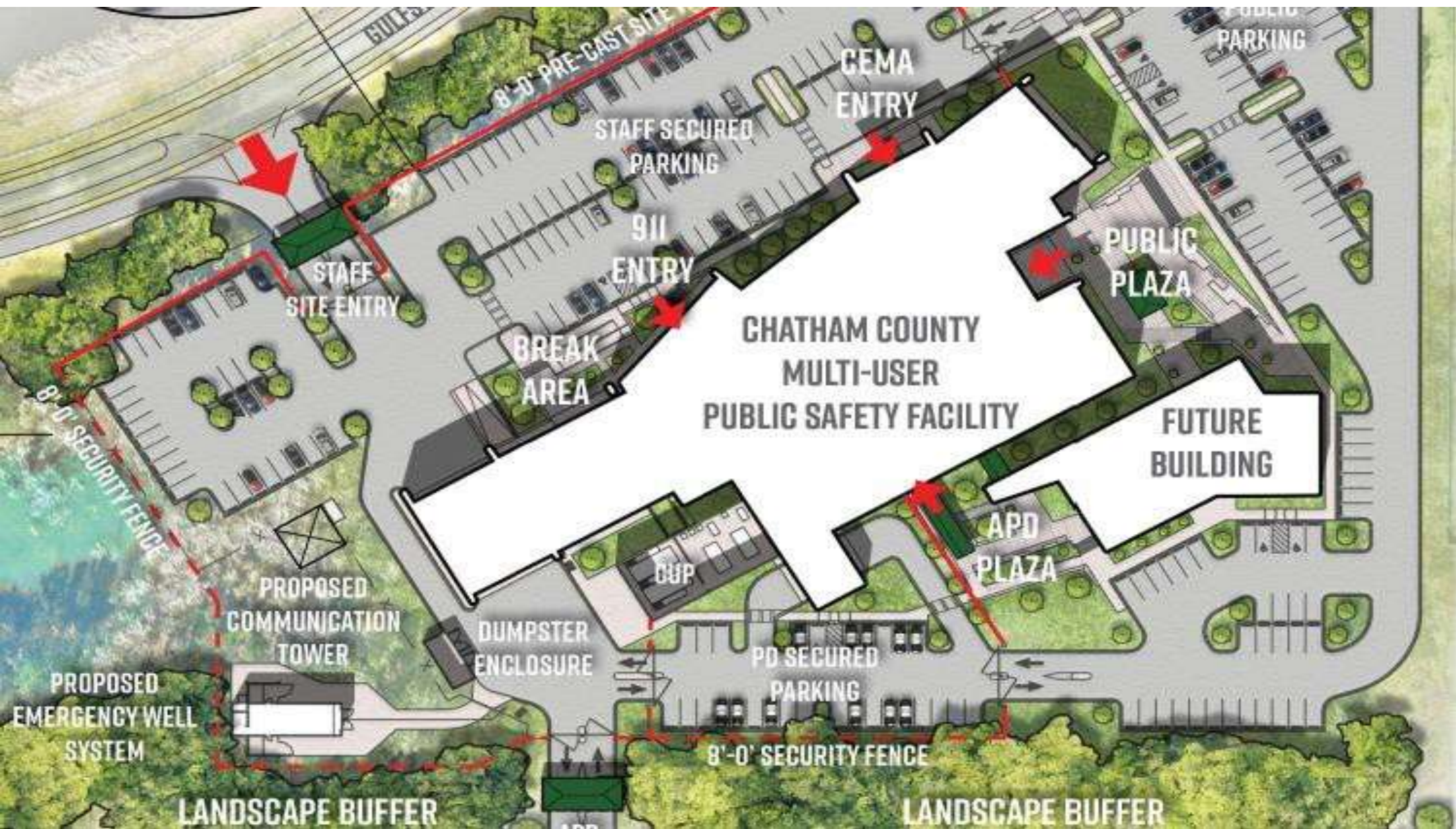
Chatham Current Emergency Operations Center

- Primary Facility located in the basement of the Old Courthouse
 - 72 available workstations
 - Physically separated over two floors and closed off section
 - No dedicated sleeping space available on site
 - 8 miles from the Dispatch Center
 - Basement has history of flooding
- Secondary Facility located at the Police Annex
 - 68 available workstations
 - No breakout rooms for Command Policy Group
 - Within same facility as Dispatch Center
 - Limited access for media
 - No available sleeping space dedicated on site



Facility Site

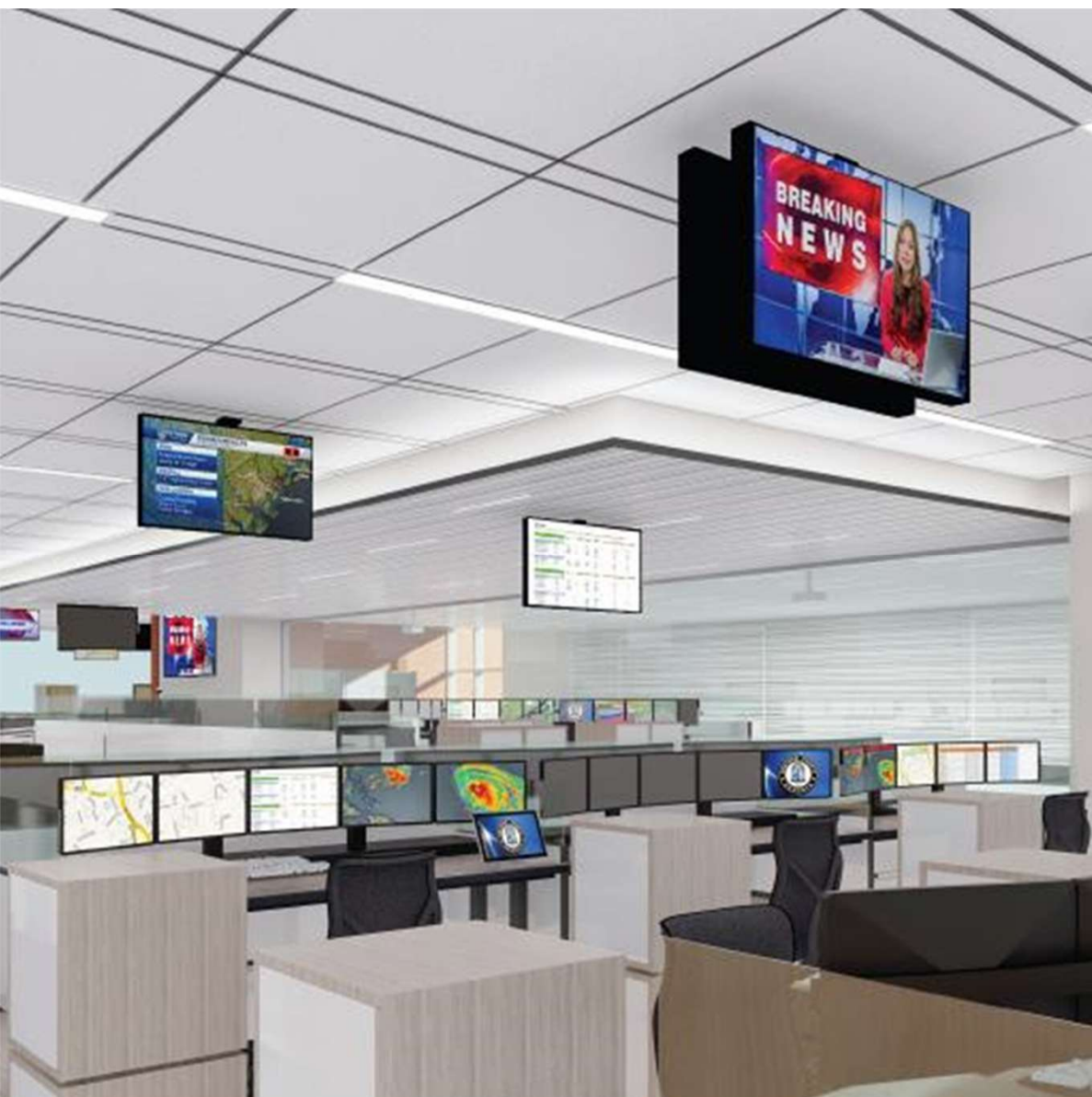
- Access to Savannah - Georgia Ports Authority

- Major Railways: CSX & Norfolk Southern



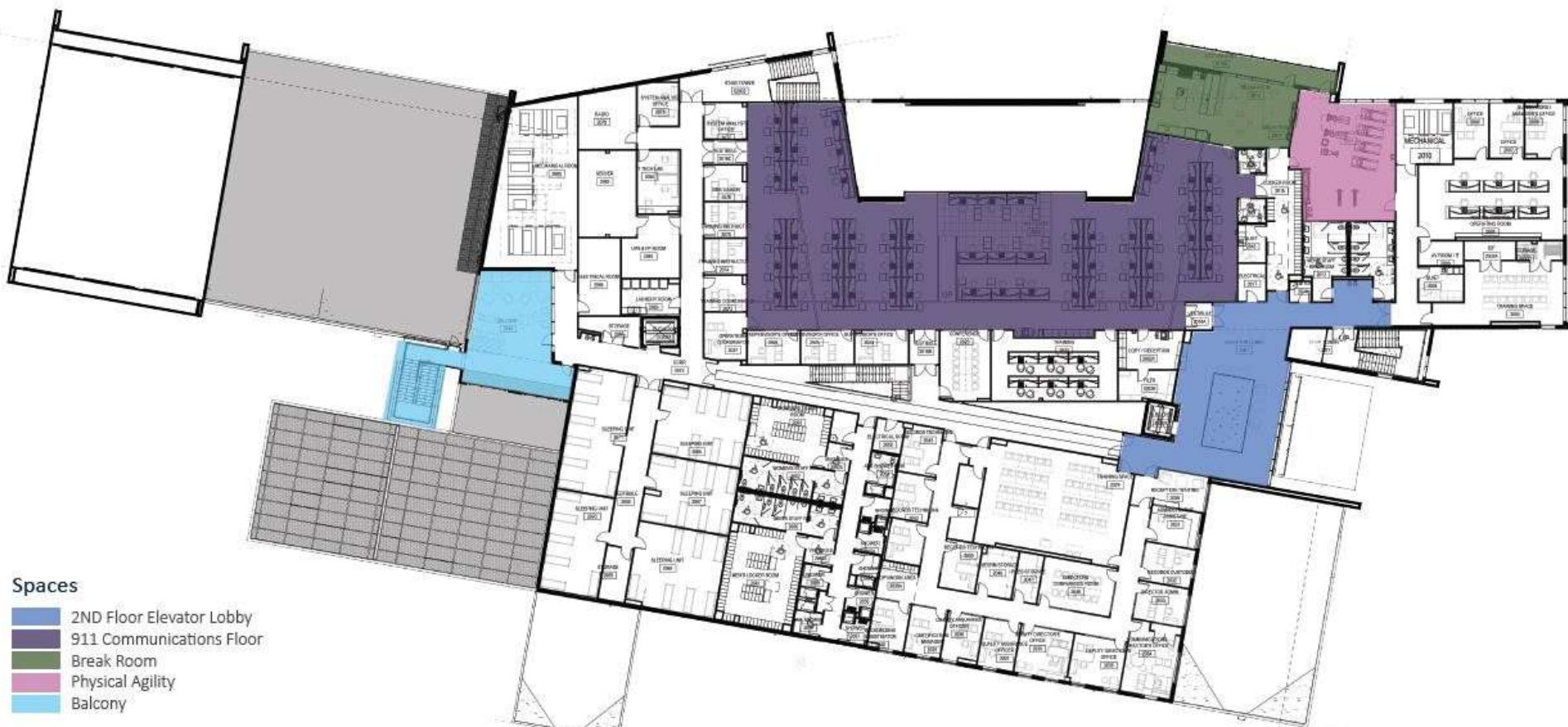
