Welcome to PoliteMail!

If you're a brand-new user of PoliteMail, we're glad to have you aboard! PoliteMail is a very powerful application that allows you to create better internal email messages faster, more consistently, and with detailed metrics to monitor performance over time.

PoliteMail is a powerful platform with a range of tools that can be configured to match your organization's security requirements and your specific Exchange and Microsoft Outlook environment.

What Can You Do with PoliteMail?

Here's some of the things PoliteMail is capable of:

- Create email templates that can be easily shared among fellow users.
- Process large sends far faster than Outlook normally could.
- Create and share content such as images, attachments, and links.
- Create internal email campaigns and analyze performance.
- Use segmentation to analyze message performance by business, region, or other categories.
- Create Brand Themes for consistent fonts and formatting.
- Access your standard address book, as well as create your own custom mailing lists in PoliteMail.
- Have your choice of using two different editors, the PoliteMail Builder or Beefree.
- Get AI-powered suggestions on your subject line to maximize engagement.
- Expand distribution lists so your message doesn't look like a mass mailing.
- Test-send your message so you can see how it will look before it goes out.

Baby Steps

But let's start small. This guide is designed to walk you through the different interfaces of PoliteMail, logging in for the first time, understanding the general layout, sending your first message, and reviewing the metrics.

The PoliteMail Interfaces



PoliteMail for Outlook Desktop

PoliteMail for the desktop allows you to use PoliteMail without ever leaving the Outlook application. At the same time, you can use the many tools and add-ins that Outlook has to offer.

How to install: PoliteMail for the desktop requires installation of a COM Addin and is available only for Microsoft Windows.

How it looks: You will see a POLITEMAIL tab in the Outlook ribbon toolbar. A PoliteMail button will also be displayed when you start composing a new message.

You can always contact your PoliteMail Account Manager to find out which edition(s) you have.



PoliteMail for Microsoft 365

PoliteMail for M365 allows you to use PoliteMail if you're on the "new" Outlook or Outlook.com. Users cannot access metrics or settings, but you can easily toggle PoliteMail Online when needed.

How to install: PM365 requires installation of a Modern Addin, which is different from the older COM Addin.

How to tell if you're using it: A PoliteMail flag button in the Addins section of your toolbar will show when you compose a message. When you click on it, a PoliteMail pane will open on the right side of your screen.



PoliteMail Online

PoliteMail Online (PMO) offers a more modern interface and many newer features not found with the Outlook Desktop edition – no downloads required. You still have access to your address book, but it is not a part of Microsoft Outlook.

How to install: No installation is needed. Simply type in your server name as the url in your browser.

How to tell if you're using it: PoliteMail Online does not have a ribbon toolbar across the top of your screen like Outlook does. A hamburger button ≡ shows in the upper left to toggle your settings, content, and metrics.



PoliteMail Unified App

Starting with version 5.4 of PoliteMail, the PoliteMail Unified App (PMUA) is available, which embeds the PoliteMail Online interface in Outlook for the Desktop as well as Outlook for M365, so you have the same interface and features no matter what platform you are on!

How to install: PMUA requires installation of Modern Addin (this is different from the Modern Addin for M365).

How to tell if you're using it: PMUA allows you to use the PMO interface from the Outlook desktop as well as Outlook for M365.

Connecting for the First Time

Before you can start sending and measuring email messages, you must first activate the PoliteMail software and connect to the PoliteMail Server.

Desktop

COM Add-in must be installed on your PC. May be installed remotely by IT, or manually.

M365

Modern Add-in must be installed on your PC. May be installed remotely by IT, or manually via the app store.

Online, PMUA

No installation required, just open your browser and enter your server name as the URL.

If you're using a username and password to access PoliteMail, you may receive an email saying "Your PoliteMail Account is Ready". Your username and password is included in this email. You can then run the .exe file to download and install PoliteMail.

If prompted to establish a connection with your server, enter the URL of your server and how email will be sent. The PoliteMail Server is recommended and fastest; you may also have Graph as an option.

- If you are using **Single Sign-On** as a connection method, please contact your IT department for help signing on.

Sending Email via the PoliteMail Server not only overcomes list size as well as ISP send volume limitations, but will send email much faster.

Sending Your First Message

Address

Clicking the 'To' button in any edition of PoliteMail gives you access to your full Exchange address book.

There are also a number of User Preferences you can adjust if you like. These are detailed in the [Knowledge Base](#).

- You don't need to use Bcc's with PoliteMail; PoliteMail will automatically expand any distribution list you use, and all recipients will actually be sent the message individually, without seeing any other recipients.
- You can also [create your own lists in PoliteMail](#) for your own use!

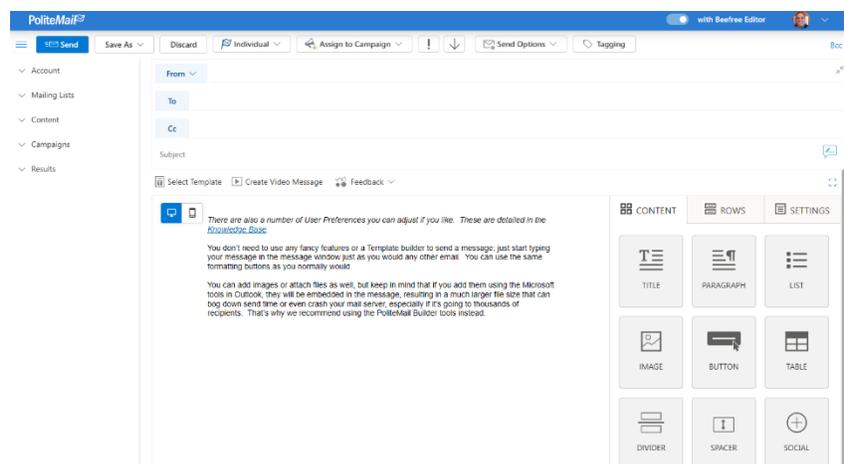
Compose

You don't need to use any fancy features or a Template builder to send a message; just start typing your message in the message window just as you would any other email. You can use the same formatting buttons as you normally would

 You can add images or attach files as well, but keep in mind that if you add them using the Microsoft tools in Outlook, they will be embedded in the message, resulting in a much larger file size that can bog down send time or even crash your mail server, especially if it's going to thousands of recipients. That's why we recommend using the PoliteMail Builder tools instead.

Composing with Beefree

If you have toggled over to using Beefree, you cannot just type right away. You start with an empty Row, and you must select a content block (such as a Title, Paragraph, Image, etc) from the Content tab on the right, and drag it onto the Row before you can type anything.



Turn On Measurement

Before you send your message, you need to enable PoliteMail measurement so you can get metrics on how your message is received.

Desktop

Click the PoliteMail Flag to enable measurement, and then select a Measurement Mode from the drop-down.

M365

Click the PoliteMail Flag button in the toolbar to open the PoliteMail panel on the right. Use the drop-down menu by the large 'Send & Measure' button to select the measurement mode.

Online, PMUA

Measurement is automatically enabled. Click on the flag button in the PoliteMail toolbar to select a measurement mode.

Mode	Description
Individual	The individual's email address is associated with the interactions.
Anonymous	The email address is NOT associated with the interactions (GDPR-Compliant).
Aggregate	No email addresses are collected, all metrics are non-unique summations by device.

Other Options Before Sending

PoliteMail offers many options you can use with your message. Here's some of the most common:

Option	Description
Preflight Test Send	Creates an exact copy of the current message addressed to yourself as a test that will allow you to verify content, layout, and links. The subject will be preceded with PREVIEW.
Edit Preheader Text	Allows you to change the text your recipients will see when the message is displayed in Outlook before it is actually opened.
Suppress Auto-Replies	Suppresses all automatic emails for this message. Works only when using Global contacts from your Exchange server within your internal domain and is not supported if sending via Microsoft Graph.
Schedule Send	Enables you to set a specific future date and time for the message to be sent. Works across time zones!
Expire Message	Allows you to set an expiration date for the message, after which it cannot be viewed. In PoliteMail for M365, this option is found in the center of the pane.
Direct Replies To	Allows you to specify a different inbox where bounced messages will return.

What About the Builders?

Builders in PoliteMail allow you to create Templates, Manage Content, create Brand Themes, share those with other users, and more! In addition, content in an editor that you insert in a message is stored on the PoliteMail server and is not embedded directly in the message like it is in Outlook, resulting in a much smaller file size and speeding up sending – especially with images and attachments.

PoliteMail offers two different Builders you can use, shown below. Each offers some things the other doesn't have, so we recommend you try both. Most new users find Beefree a little easier to use, but be warned: Templates you make in one Builder are not compatible with the other!

Desktop

When composing a Measured Message, go to **Message > PoliteMail > Show / Hide PoliteMail Builder**.

M365

Click the PoliteMail Flag button to open the PoliteMail pane on the right, then click the hamburger button  .

Online, PMUA

When composing a message, click 'PoliteMail Builder' in the toolbar.

Metrics

One of the most impactful features of PoliteMail is the reporting capability. After sending your measured PoliteMail message, you will be able to see results within the Results button.

Desktop

Go to **POLITEMAIL > Results > Messages**.

M365

Metrics are not found in PoliteMail 365; you will need to click on the  to switch to PoliteMail Online to access them.

Online, PMUA

From 'Results' in the left pane, select **Results > Messages**.

The report is laid out to allow you to quickly see who you sent the message to, opens, clicks, and much more. Don't worry about low numbers – you're just starting!

To provide you with as much insight as possible, the Metrics report contains a LOT of data. Here are some resources for more information:

- Use the  icon at the top right of the report to view a definition of the various metrics.

Desktop

A Request Support button is in the POLITEMAIL tab of the ribbon toolbar.

M365

Click on the ≡ to open the Navigation pane, then go to **Settings > Request Support**.

Online, PMUA

Click on your avatar in the upper right of the screen and select 'Request Support'.

The Request Support button will generate an email with your account information and an error log for our technical support team to use in troubleshooting the issue. Enter a brief synopsis of the issue you are experiencing and screenshots if applicable.
